This will be my last report from my outpost here in Cork Ireland as my Irish volunteer year is sadly, coming to a close. Still, on the bright side, it seems like a good time to share some of my favorite moments from this year. I must start by saying that L'Arche Cork has incredible core members who make their program truly something extraordinary. Over the last year, I have had the privilege to share life with Aoife, Sharon, Mary, Nuala, Eileen, and Jim. The six of them not only opened their home but their hearts to me. When I look back at the past II and a half months so many fond memories flood my head. Days filled with friendship and laughter. Highlights of my time here include our weekly trips to Mass and Le Chelie for tea and scones, our weekly house reflections, outings to the cinema, walking in Ballincollig Park, our house holiday to Skibbereen, and the retreat to Rostrevor, Co. Down, in Northern Ireland.

Hello!

Several passages in the Bible reveal to us that God does not call the qualified, rather he qualifies the called. For example:

- 1. For the LORD gives wisdom, from his mouth come knowledge and understanding. (New American Bible Revised Edition, Prov. 2:6)
- 2. Whom he foreordained, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified. (American Standard Version, Rom. 8:30)
- 3. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God afore prepared that we should walk in them. (American Standard Version, Eph. 2:10)

L'Arche is the perfect example of how God does this. Many of the volunteers in L'Arche have only just finished high school, and even those with higher degrees don't necessarily have relevant experience – let alone experience working with individuals with intellectual disabilities! However, this experience is not needed. Just as God provides for individuals, L'Arche provides training for volunteers and allows us to learn and gain first-hand experience. For example, I have a bachelor's degree in International Affairs. While the coursework for that degree allowed me to develop some transferable skills, none of them was directly related to social care/work. When I started in L'Arche, I never thought I would be able to complete the tasks I now complete with ease. I would not have had the confidence to assist others in their daily routines nor know how to safely administer medication. On top of all that, I learned to drive on the opposite side of the road, which as an American took a while for me to get used to! I'm glad I was able to confidently learn to drive on streets that were so foreign to me and help out my community.

Since coming to Ireland for L'Arche, I have been away from home for the longest period of my life, and I fully expected that to be a rough and difficult adjustment. When my emotions are high, I am grateful that there's always someone around who notices and jumps in to offer comfort or support -residents, staff, or the house leader.
